2020 WHAT WE WILL BUILD!

2021 will be a very exciting year for our school. We will continue to work proactively to further develop our home-school partnership as we strive to ensure that our students are provided with an environment and experience that enables them to learn and grow into the best they can be. We have so much to be proud of as a school community, and 2021 is another opportunity for us to take the next steps on our improvement journey. I have included our one-page summary sheet that lists our four key goals along with a brief outline of the key strategies that we will sue to deliver these. I will unpack these in more detail each week. This work has already started and next week we launch our new core values with a special GREAT Day on Tuesday.



15 MINUTES - 3 X TIMES A DAY

In 2021, we have dedicated 3 blocks of 15 minutes at key points throughout each school day to focus on our ley learning priorities. This strategy will ensure that we have a high level of commitment and consistency across our whole school. Dedicating and prioritising this time will ensure that all classes across the whole school are involved and teams can implement with consistency and clarity.

READING IN EVERY CLASSROOM, EVERY DAY

At 9am each day, students will build a love and passion of reading by spending time reading independently, conferencing with a teacher, sharing reading with other students and engaging with a wide variety of books and resources.

NUMBER FLUENCY IN EVERY CLASSROOM, EVERY DAY

At 11.25am each day, students will build their enthusiasm and deep thinking in numeracy by engaging in a structured number focus activity. These will be focused on our priority curriculum areas and enable students the opportunity of daily practice, sharing reasoning and challenging themselves and others to build confidence and skills.

STUDENT AGENCY & REFLECTION IN EVERY CLASSROOM, EVERY DAY

At 2.20pm each day, students will have time to think deeply and reflect on their learning. This is a key part of building a student's agency, and developing understanding and responsibility for their learning. The whole school will use prompting questions such as :

"What makes you excited about learning?" "What is a challenge you have faced?" What can you do to make 2021 a successful year of learning?"

This time provides opportunities for students to discuss, share and record their responses.

COMPASS IS HERE!

We have launched COMPASS officially and I am pleased to say that at the time of print we have over 92% of our school who have logged in and accessed the platform. We are all on a very sharp learning curve using Compass and thank you to everyone who has assisted and helped so far. I encourage you to become as familiar with using it as possible and we will update you with different parts of the program as we roll them out. In time this will include giving permissions and making payments for events, accessing Semester Reports and a variety of other important information that will ultimately strengthen our home school partnership even more. If you are having any issues accessing COMPASS please let our office team know.

MEET WITH THE TEACHER - PARENT MEETINGS

Our optional "Meet the Teacher" - Parent/Teacher interviews will be held on Wednesday 10th February between 3.50pm and 6.50pm. Whilst these interviews are not compulsory to attend, the main purpose of these meetings is for parents to meet with the teacher and pass on any pertinent information that will assist our students to have a successful year.

Bookings are made through Compass so that you can select from the times available which suit you best. These are now open and will close on Tuesday 4th February at 4pm.

ON TIME FOR SCHOOL EVERY DAY

Each day we start with music at 8.55am. This is the signal for students to enter their classrooms and get ready for learning before the 9am bell rings.

We know that getting off to a GREAT start each day is critical for learning, so we are encouraging everyone to be on time and go inside their classrooms by the 9am bell.

At the end of the day a bell will ring at 3.30pm, where students will be dismissed. At 3.45pm a second bell will ring. This is a reminder to any student who remains unsupervised in the yard that they must report to the office so that we can ensure they get home safely as yard supervision finishes at this time each day.

ROAD SAFETY AROUND SCHOOLS

Speed zones, pedestrian crossings and parking restrictions around school are there to improve the movement of traffic during peak times and maximise safety for children and road users.

It is vital that adults, we leads by example and set good road safety practices travelling to and from school. As such we are asking all parents and carers to observe and obey parking signs and in particular No Stopping and No parking signs.

Banyule City Council have asked us to remind our school community that it is an offence to:

double park by stopping next to a legally parked vehicle, even for a short time or to drop off/pick up passengers Stop or park across a driveway, footpath or dividing strip

Stop or park within 10 metres of an intersection or corner that doesn't have traffic lights

Stop or park across or in a bus zone.

Council Local Laws Officers will be active around our school area to issue warnings and fines.
